



Appaloosa Youth Foundation Scholarship Application Information

The Appaloosa Youth Foundation awards scholarships to outstanding youth members of the Appaloosa Horse Club or Appaloosa Youth Association wishing to pursue higher education. Scholarships are awarded annually, with the entire amount paid to the school's financial office of the College/University that the student will be attending. Awards are paid at the beginning of the student's first semester, are non-transferable from the recipient and must be used within one year. Each Applicant may only enter in one of the three categories, and completed applications must be received in the ApHC office no later than June 1.

NO EXCEPTIONS WILL BE GRANTED

I. Territory Scholarship

Awards of up to \$1,000 each may be awarded to one graduating High School Senior in each one of the six territories. One Scholarship may be awarded to a student graduating from a foreign school with a comparable system. "At-Large" scholarships may also be awarded, at random, in this category

II. Continuing Education Scholarship

This \$1,000 scholarship may be available to one college student who will be attending college in the fall of 2010 with a first or second semester sophomore standing. This applicant must have maintained a GPA of at least 2.5, or higher on a 4.0 scale, or a 3.8, or higher on a 6.0 scale during their freshman year in college.

III. Sagebrush Circuit Lew & Jo Eklund Scholarship

One \$2,000 scholarship may be awarded to a college junior, senior, or graduate student pursuing a DEGREE in an EQUINE-RELATED field. The student must be currently maintaining a G.P.A. of 3.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale or 5.2 or higher on a 6.0 scale.

AYF Eligibility and Criteria for Scholarship Applicants

Eligibility

Each applicant must be a current member of the Appaloosa Horse Club or the Appaloosa Youth Association to be eligible to apply for an Appaloosa Youth Foundation scholarship. Students who are in the immediate family of an employee, representative, or national director of the ApHC or the AYF are not eligible to apply.

Criteria

Each application is carefully reviewed by a qualified panel of educators selected by the Appaloosa Youth Foundation. Scores are based upon scholastic aptitude, leadership potential, the ability to communicate community and civic responsibility, and financial need content and presentation. Evidence of involvement in the Appaloosa industry along with general knowledge of and accomplishments in horsemanship are also considered. Scoring is done in the following categories:

- *Scholarship
- *Presentation/following all instructions
- *Essay
- *Demonstrated financial need
- *Extra-curricular/civic activities

Because of the degree of competition and difficulty of acquired skills that are represented, it is to each applicant's advantage to submit a neat, readable, timely and informative application adhering to the rules and specifications of the application.

~ REQUIREMENTS~

All scholarships:

1. The application must be completed on an official application and must be filled out by the person applying for the scholarship.
2. An official academic transcript from the applicant's most recent high school or college semester/quarter must accompany the application.
3. A photograph of the candidate must be attached to the application. No color copies or scanned photos will be accepted. The photo and application become the property of the AYF and will not be returned.
4. Three letters of personal recommendation must be mailed *separately* to the ApHC office at the address listed below. It is suggested that they be address the applicant's scholastic career, community involvement, and participation in equine events or organizations. These letters may be from instructors, colleagues, peers, or other qualified persons.
Letters from relatives are NOT accepted.
5. All applications must be completed and received in the ApHC office by June 1 in order to be considered by the scholarship selection committee. Mail application and material to:

Territory Scholarships only:

(For students entering college as a freshman)

1. A copy of your official ACT, SAT, or similar exam results must be attached.
2. In order to apply for this scholarship, the applicant must hold a high school diploma or equivalent certification, or be anticipating high school graduation this year. GPA must be at least a 2.5 on a 4.0 scale or 3.8 on a 6.0 scale.
3. Proof of College/University acceptance

Continuing Scholarship only:

(For students entering college as a sophomore)

1. The applicant must submit proof of future enrollment in an institute of higher education along with the application.
2. The applicant must submit an essay of 200 to 400 words. Specific essay guidelines are contained in this application.
3. In order to apply for this scholarship, the applicant must have maintained a GPA of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale or 3.8 on a 6.0 scale during their year at a college or university.

Sagebrush Scholarship only:

(For college upper classmen/juniors & seniors or graduate students-both must be pursuing a degree in an equine-related area)

1. Proof of future enrollment in graduate school, or as a junior or senior in the student's college or educational institution is required with the application.
2. In order to apply for this scholarship, the applicant must have maintained a GPA of at least 3.5 on a 4.0 scale, or at least 5.2 on a 6.0 scale.
