JACKSON, Mississippi—Youth from throughout the nation gathered in Jackson, Miss., June 23-28, at the Mississippi State Fairgrounds to compete for coveted Top Ten placings at the celebrated 2008 World Championship Appaloosa Youth Show. Kara Kaufmann, a 10-year-old participant from Stroudsburg, Pa., competed against the finest Appaloosa youth competitors in the nation to earn several Top Ten placings and the prestigious High Point Walk/Trot Exhibitor honor.

Kara and her three Appaloosas had a remarkable show, placing in 10 classes at the 2008 World Championship Appaloosa Show. All three of Kara's Appaloosas, each one specializing in particular discipline, led her to at least one World Champion title.

Kara and her 3-year-old gelding, Tell Me More, earned the top prize in the Walk/Trot Hunter Under Saddle, 10 and Under class. Kara and her 15-year-old mare, Eye Q, were named the World Champions in Walk/Trot Keyhole Race, 10 and Under. Kara and her 6-year-old mare, Enchanted Paradise, won first place in the Walk/Trot Showmanship at Halter, 10 and Under class.

Kara and Eye Q earned multiple placings in games events including: 4th place in Walk/Trot Nez Perce Stake Race, 10 & Under; 4th place in Walk/Trot Figure Eight Stake Race; and 9th place in Walk/Trot Camas Prairie Stump Race, 10 and Under.

Kara and Enchanted Paradise earned multiple placings in several events as well including: Reserve Champion in Walk/Trot Hunt Seat Equitation, 10 and Under; Reserve Champion in Walk/Trot Western Horsemanship, 10 and Under; 7th in Walk/Trot Trail; and 10th in Hunter in Hand, Mares.

Kara's outstanding performances in numerous Walk/Trot events earned her the Youth High Point Walk/Trot Exhibitor honor, and was awarded a custom sterling silver belt buckle.

The Appaloosa Horse Club is proud to have youth competitors as dedicated to the Appaloosa breed as Kara Kaufmann, and commends him and his Appaloosa for all of their hard work.

The 2008 World Championship Appaloosa Youth was followed immediately by the National Appaloosa Show, the longest running single-breed championship in the country.
